Facilitate holistic care and rehabilitate children morally through character behaviour transformation. We provide residential care and rehabilitation for parentless children most of whom are affected by HIV/AIDS and street children in Kawangware, Kangemi and Kibera slums, Nairobi Kenya. Currently the homes cater for 250 children with 20 having been successfully integrated back
